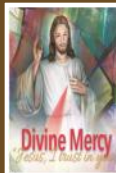

## BUDDING ARTISTS

Children and art are a happy combination, and those attending Saint James School are blessed with many opportunities for creative expression. Two art teachers, Mrs. Kara Sabatella, and Ms. Casey Boutot, help students develop their artistic skills in a variety of media.

Both teachers bring to the task a wealth of professional experience as artists and teachers. Mrs. Sabatella is in her eighth year teaching art at Saint James School. She has nearly two decades of experience teaching art in three different schools, as well as craft stores, private art lessons, and summer camps. Ms. Boutot is also a talented artist who has put her skills to use both as a personal hobby and a business. She has taught Grades 4-8, and is in her fourth year at Saint James School.

Mrs. Sabatella clearly finds joy in creating art with the children. "Each time I teach art, I wait to see what the children will teach me," she says. "They are so naturally creative at this age that they spontaneously think of really cool ways to personalize and enhance whatever we are working on." The art teachers are especially grateful to have their own laptop computers and use of the classroom SMARTBoards to enhance their instruction, always using visuals and to showcase real-life works of art from the various artists the students learn about. The middle students are also exposed to a more structured form of art — such as model building and engineering design — in their STREAM classes, where they are using knowledge and skills from a variety of academic disciplines to problem solve.

The very popular after-school Book & Art Club, a joint effort of the art teachers in collaboration with Mrs. Linda Carpenter, school librarian, also gives the younger students a chance to practice their art skills.

Each book and art club has a different theme, where students listen to the reading of a story, and then respond to the theme of the book through a related art project.

A big celebration of art also occurs each year at Saint James School with the annual Art Show. Combined with an ice cream social, the art show is a very popular annual event in the school community. This year, the Art Show will take place in mid-April. Every student at the school, from Pre-Kindergarten through 8<sup>th</sup> Grade, will have at least one piece

of art on display. Art showcased will be in a wide range of styles, modeled after artists from the various genres the students learn about including pop art, still-life, abstract, and sculpture.

Art is also an important part of the day's activities at the school's popular summer camp program.

Each day campers will work with Mrs. Sabatella on art projects related to the day's theme. Summer camp will begin the week of June 26th, immediately following the

end of the school year.

Through activities both in and outside the classroom, students at Saint James School learn that art can help them appreciate the world around them and increase their enjoyment of life.
